During Lent we sink into the dark depths of the truth of our sinfulness bringing us to nothing. It is then that Christ becomes everything in that He offers us forgiveness of sins upon our repentance. The Season will culminate Thursday, March 28th as we observe Holy Thursday, also known as Maundy Thursday. There is a powerful, centuriesold observance of three holy days of Christ's Passover known as the Triduum- Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil on Saturday. The Triduum is really one service in three parts leading to the observance and celebration of our Lord's Resurrection on Easter Sunday. It is a time of restrained joy in which we do not receive the Benediction Maundy Thursday or Good Friday. Here at Bethel Lutheran Church we observe the Triduum with Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, preparing us for Easter Sunday.

Maundy Thursday service is scheduled for Thursday, March 28th at 6:30 P.M. with Confession and Absolution, Service of the Word, Service of the Sacrament and the Stripping of the Altar.

Good Friday service is scheduled for Friday, March 29th at 6:30 P.M. This will be a Tenebrae Vespers service. Tenebrae means "darkness". Historically, the sanctuary is darkened as we hear the account of our Lord's arrest, trial, crucifixion and death.

Easter Sunday, March 28th, we celebrate our Lord's Resurrection with services at 7:00 A.M., 9:00 A.M. and 11:00 A.M. It is because of Jesus' Resurrection on the first Easter Sunday that the early Christians marked the weekly sabbath as Sunday, another powerful, centuries-old tradition in the Church.

Mark your calendars for Holy Week and the celebration of Jesus' Resurrection. Together, let us immerse ourselves in this tradition. Invite a friend or another family! And, let us pray for the Lord's peace and blessing during the conclusion of this Season of Lent, preparing us for the celebration of Easter. The Seasons, feasts and festivals of the church year really do serve us well in our daily life with Christ- a life of daily repentance and forgiveness, keeping us prepared for the final Day of the Lord.

As well, attend Easter breakfast served 8:00 A.M. to 11:00 A.M. Children are invited to Bethel's Easter Egg Hunt at 10:00 A.M. It is such a delight to our Lord for households of faith to come together!
